## Punctuation

Serial comma (a, b, and c)

Scare quotes ( " ") used for "feminist" when functioning as a term, dialogue, direct quotes, and titles of people ("anti-feminists", "man hater", "bra burner", or "radical.")

Single quotes ( ' ') used for single-word emphasis
